Playing fields

In March Playing field committee asked PC to clarify previous request. Tennis court is the priority, and the tennis court is the best asset. Quotes in for repairs £1200-1500 committee asking for funds from PC.

Currently the playing field committee are not looking to lock the tennis court.

Saturday 5th May tennis court being cleaned, and lines painted

Planning new events through the year etc.

Village Hall has pledged breakfast money.

Boules pitch to be done by volunteers.

Currently no grant money available until playing field committee has pledged, for regular maintenance and west boundary fence repair. Any money they have is for children's play area.

Insurance last year was £109 and PC paid for this.

Fundraising activities:-

Tree planting and other day £300

Tennis cleaning day will have bucket out for donations.

Sept 1st activities in playing field as well as hall and pub for waterworks

Once boules open can have competitions

Evening in Village Hall in autumn folk music and meal

Possible Moors inn do.

Looking at grant options (Joel) Gill was suggested as an option for applying for grants.

Would like more villagers on the playing field committee.

Fracking

From the Advisory group the PEDL (Petroleum extraction development licence) not cancelled. INEOS want to carry out seismic test, Parks refused, but INEOS have not pulled back. and they are still wanting to frack from outside park. The AG have provided info for PC and landowners. Contacting other villages along A170 corridor. INEOS threatening National Trust in court case to allow them access for seismic testing. Disputing 500m set back from houses National parks, areas of natural beauty. Had a dispute with potash mine over territory within the park. 10th May is a deadline on changes to national planning policy which PC and individuals can put their views forward. National government may change national planning which would secede any local planning rules. The AG wants to know if PC should adopt a fracking statement? And have provided one adopted by Great Barugh, RDC has a stronger policy. Hoping to have an information evening for the village to give a broad view of fracking. Some concern that the advisory group to the PC are all anti fracking and haven't asked the parishioners their views.
